2. China-Portugal (Portugal) Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH) Experiments Extended for Another Five Years

FROM JANUARY 1, 2022 UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 2026

According to the joint decision of CNIPA and INPI, China-Portugal (Portugal) Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH) Experiments will be extended for another five years from January 1, 2022 until December 31, 2026.

Relevant requirements and process of submitting PPH requests in the two sides will remain unchanged.

CNIPA started the PPH experiments with INPI on January 1, 2014, which have been extended twice and will terminate until December 31, 2021. (Translated from CNIPA Website Chinese Version)... Read more

3. Jamaica Joins the Hague System

Jamaica is the latest country to join the Hague System bringing the total number of countries covered to 93. The Government of Jamaica deposited its instrument of accession to the 1999 Geneva Act of the Hague Agreement on November 10, 2021. Jamaica is the 67th contracting party to the 1999 Act and 76th member of the Hague Union.

What does this mean for designers worldwide? - From February 10, 2022, companies and designers in Jamaica will be able to seek international protection of their designs, in as many of the 93 countries covered by the Hague System as desired, facilitating their expansion into international markets. ABU DHABI – As the United Arab Emirates continues to improve the Intellectual Property environment to be an attractive market for businesses, it decided to bring legal reform to the laws relating to Intellectual Property. The new IP laws were approved by Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the UAE, and will be fully enacted starting from January 2, 2022. The new amendments on Intellectual Property laws are summarized as follows:

Trademarks Law - The federal law concerning trademarks was amended to expand the scope of protection to cover three-dimensional trademarks, holograms and sound trademarks. The amendments also include registration of geographical names of trademarks or products whose name is associated... Read more

In public oral proceedings today, in combined cases J 8/20 and J 9/20, the Legal Board of Appeal of the EPO confirmed that under the European Patent Convention (EPC) an inventor designated in a patent application must be a human being.

The board dismissed the applicant's appeal. The written decision and reasons will be issued in due course and will be available via the European Patent Register. The Boards of Appeal have issued a communiqué with further details.

From December 01, 2021, in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding for Remittance of (PCT) Fees signed between China National Intellectual Property Administration and World Intellectual Property Organization, China National Intellectual Property Administration will collect the fees of PCT application in the international phase subject to the RMB standard published by the World Intellectual Property Organization, which will no longer be calculated by the Swiss Franc standard.

The EAPO enables applicants to use the Digital Access Service for Priority Documents of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO DAS) in relation to industrial design applications from December 1, 2021.

As of that date, applicants, when claiming priority in an industrial design application in accordance with Rule 80 (1) of the Patent Regulations under the Eurasian Patent Convention on an earlier application previously placed in the WIPO DAS digital library may submit to EAPO the access code for this application within WIPO DAS instead of a submitted copy of the earlier application.

A Bilateral Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH) pilot program commenced between the Indian Patent Office (IPO) and the Japan Patent Office (JPO) with effect from 5th December 2019. The guidelines in this regard have been published on the website of Controller General of Patents, Designs & Trade Marks. The IPO will start accepting Form 5-1 under Chapter 5 of the PPH Guidelines for the third year of the pilot program with effect from 20th December 2021. The number of requests will be limited to 100. The following points are to be noted while submitting a request to IPO under the said PPH program:

- The number of the requests for the PPH in IPO will be limited to 100 cases per year on first come first serve basis. Read more

Since January 1, 2021, TIPO has been implementing the "Positive Patent Examination Pilot Program for Startups" to offer assistance in evaluating patent acquisition probability and provide advice on ways to promptly obtain patent rights.

Upon receiving positive responses to the results of the pilot program, TIPO has decided to amend and conduct it for an additional year.

Moreover, during the pilot program of 2022, there is a cap of 6 applications each month and a limit of 5 applications per startup per year. Read more

In order to promote the research and development of green patents and accelerate commercialization of related products, the scope of applicability of AEP will be expanded to include green technologies such as energy-saving, carbon emission reduction, and resource-saving technologies.

In addition, applications on the grounds of "essential to commercial exploitation" and " inventions related to green technologies" will have their accelerated examination results issued within 6 months instead of 9 after filing all necessary documents, expediting the examination process of relevant cases.
