1. CHINA: Draft Geographical Indications Guidelines

CNIPA OFFERED AN INVITATION TO COMMENT ON ITS NEWLY DRAFTED "GUIDELINES REGARDING THE RULING OF GENERIC NAMES.. From March 5 to May 9, 2020, China's National Intellectual Property Administration (CNIPA) offered an invitation to comment on its newly drafted "Guidelines Regarding the Ruling of Generic Names in the Protection of Geographical Indication" (the Guidelines). The succinctly drafted Guidelines have only 10 articles, the key terms being in Articles 3 and 7. Article 3 defines "generic name" as a name which "has been commonly used in China, although it is related to the place, region or country where a product was originally produced or sold. That name is used in China to refer to specific production methods, specific standards, specific quality, specific types or specific categories of products." RELIEF AVAILABLE TO PATENTEES IN VIEW OF THE COVID-19 OUTBREAK FOR SUBMISSION OF INITIAL PATENT TERM EXTENSIO. The United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) considers the effects of the COVID-19 outbreak to be an "extraordinary situation" within the meaning of 37 CFR 1.183. In accordance with this notice, the USPTO will permit patentees to file initial patent term extension applications that meet certain criteria via EFS-Web or Patent Center. According to the "Legal Framework for Patent Electronic System" (https://www.uspto.gov/patents-applicationprocess/filing-online/legal-framework-efs-web), certain documents are prohibited from being filed via the USPTO patent electronic filing systems. 9. Singaporean Daren Tang Officially Appointed as the Next WIPO Director General

DAREN TANG, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF THE IPOS HAS BEEN OFFICIALLY APPOINTED AS THE NEXT DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE WIPO Singapore, 8 May 2020 – Mr Daren Tang, Chief Executive of the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore (IPOS) has been officially appointed as the next Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO). WIPO is a specialised United Nations (UN) agency based in Geneva, Switzerland, with 193 member states and an annual revenue in excess of S\$600 million. Mr Tang will take over the helm of WIPO on 1 October 2020 for a term of six years. This marks the first time a Singaporean will lead a UN agency, and WIPO's first Director General from Asia. 2. In accordance with the temporary authority provided by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) today further extended the time to file certain patent-related documents and to pay certain required fees. The USPTO has already extended various deadlines twice, with the latest extension expiring at the end of this month. However, the USPTO recognizes that the COVID-19 pandemic continues to impose various hardships, especially on small businesses and individual inventors.
