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01. Enhancing the national phase for international patent applications

PCT BIBLIO. DATA WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE RECORDED IN THE SAME FORMAT AS WIPO RECORDS We're making some changes to make it easier to enter the national phase. Over the coming months, we'll upgrade online services to integrate with the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) ePCT system — WIPO's online portal for filing and managing Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) applications. This integration will allow the most up-to-date information and relevant documents of each WIPO number or PCT application to be downloaded at the time of entering the Australian national phase of the application process.... <u>Read more</u>

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02. The Unitary Patent is to become a reality

CENTRALISED PLATFORM FOR EUROPE-WIDE PATENT LITIGATION BEFORE THE UNIFIED PATENT COURT

Today, the German government deposited its instrument of ratification of the Agreement on a Unified Patent Court (UPCA) with the Council of the European Union. The step marks the successful completion of the necessary ratification procedures by the participating EU member states for the Unitary Patent Package to become effective for currently 17 states. The new system is now ready to enter into operation on 1 June 2023. More countries are expected to join in the future.

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Welcoming the news, EPO President António Campinos said, "The deposit by Germany opens the door for a new era of IP protection in Europe. Under the Unitary Patent system, European businesses will be able to benefit from broader and more effective patent protection at lower costs, which is particularly important for smaller entities..... <u>Read more</u>

03. USPTO ushers in new era with introduction of electronic patent grants

EGRANT PROCESS SIGNIFICANTLY **DECREASES USPTO'S NEEDS**

WASHINGTON—Beginning April 18, 2023, the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) is shifting towards issuing paper waste-reducing <u>electronic</u> patent grants (eGrants) to patent recipients—a new process that delivers the official copy of patent grants in an electronic format. We will provide a **PRINTING AND MAILING** bound paper version as a ceremonial copy throughout a limited transition period, and then for a nominal fee thereafter.

"ONE WINDOW" FOR **APPLICANTS OF THE** EURASIAN SPACE TO PATENT THEIR **INVENTIONS** WORLDWIDE

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- The first international application has been published on the website of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), where the Eurasian Patent Office (EAPO), in accordance with its status as an International Searching Authority (ISA) and an International Preliminary Examination Authority (IPEA), was involved at all stages.
- The international application filed through the EAPO describes a new system and a way to sell goods and services using a user mobile device with an installed application. With their help, the seller can sell more goods and services without attracting additional human resources. The buyer, in turn, gets the opportunity to purchase goods or services below market value at a price equal to the cost of the certificate.....<u>Read more</u>

05. Updates to the Patents Examination Manual

THE MAIN SUBSTANTIVE CHANGE IS TO CLARIFY THAT THIS REGULATION APPLIES TO THE SCOPE OF THE RESPECTIVE CLAIMS IPONZ has updated its Patents Examination Manual to clarify our practice for situations where a divisional patent application's claims overlap with those of its parent.

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06. TIPO Enhances Online Systems with Addition of New Administrative Appeal and Litigation Case Information

USERS CAN BROWSE ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS & LITIGATION INFORMATION & DOWNLOAD

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TIPO has collaborated with the Petitions and Appeals Committee of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and the Judicial Yuan to increase the accessibility of intellectual property information in Taiwan. As a result of this partnership, TIPO has integrated patent and trademark case information (including this year and the last five years) and litigation information (dating back to 2021) into systems such as "Patent Public Information Inquiry System", "Trademark Search," and the "My Filings" section on the e-Filing platform, allowing users to access complete case information. These services were officially made available to the public on December 19, 2022..... Read more

7. Enforcement of the revised patent law on relaxation of requirements for restoration of patent rights

IF THERE IS A JUSTIFIABLE REASON FOR BEING UNABLE TO FILE..." WERE CHANGED TO "(IF THE DELAY) WAS UNINTENTIONAL" The Japanese Patent Law as amended in 2021 (hereinafter referred to as the "Amended Japanese Patent Law") will come into effect on 1 April 2023. Along with this amendment, the regulations under the Japanese Patent Law will also be revised.

The Japanese Patent Law amendment in 2021 was made within the scope allowed to the Contracting Parties of the Patent Law Treaty (PLT) and the Singapore Treaty on the Law of Trademarks (STLT).

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Article 12(1) of PLT requires the Contracting Parties to reinstate the rights of the applicant or owner of a patent when the applicant or owner has failed to comply with a time limit for an action in a procedure..... <u>Read more</u>

8. New Patent Annuities Procedures Implemented in Kuwait

ALL DUE ANNUITIES FOR ACTIVE PATENT APPLICATIONS MUST BE PAID THROUGH THE NEW E-SYSTEM BEFORE THE SPECIFIED DEADLINE KUWAIT – The Trademark and Patent Office of Kuwait updated its Esystem for filing patent applications, and implemented a new online payment procedure for patent annuities.

The patents that are subject to annuities due are summarized as follows:

1-National/ local applications (Paris route): At the beginning of each year subsequent to the year in which the application was filed.

2-PCT national phase: At the beginning of each year starting from the second year of the international filing date of the PCT.... <u>Read more</u>

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9. Egypt Increases Official Fees for Patent Examination

CAIRO – The Egyptian Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research issued a decision regulating the fees payable for patent examination in Egypt.

ENTERED INTO FORCE

ON FEBRUARY 22, 2023 The decision stipulates that the official fees for carrying out the patent examination have increased from EGP 17,000 to EGP 25,000. Yet, school and university students are exempted from paying such fees.

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The Japan-Taiwan Exchange Association and the Taiwan-Japan Relations Association agreed by the recognition that it would be contributed to timely obtain of a trademark right for both applicants in Japan and Taiwan, if they create and publish a concordance list of similar group codes that are used in trademark examination in Japan and Taiwan, respectively, in a way to show the corresponding relationship between the respective similar group codes (Japan-Taiwan Concordance List of Similar Group Codes....<u>Read more</u>

15. New trademark rules for protecting nontraditional marks, mandating online transactions take effect

RULES RECOGNIZE, COLOR MARKS, 3D, POSITION MARKS AND MOTION MARKS MAY BE FILED & DISTINCTIVENESS AS DEFINED UNDER THE IP CODE The Intellectual Property Office of the Philippine (IPOPHL) has promulgated the Revised Rules and Regulations on Trademarks, Service Marks, Trade Names and Marked or Stamped Containers. Replacing the revised trademark regulations of 2017, the new rules under Memorandum Circular (MC) 2023-001 prepared by the Bureau of Trademarks (BOT) took effect on 14 February 2023. "MC 2023-001 institutionalizes the protection of non-traditional visual marks. With this, IPOPHL is now clear with the acceptability of color marks per se, motion marks, position marks and hologram marks," Director General Rowel S. Barba said.<u>Read more</u>

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16. Mauritius Joins the Madrid System

MADRID OFFERS A CONVENIENT AND COST-EFFECTIVE SOLUTION FOR REGISTERING & MANAGING TM'S WORLDWIDE Mauritius has joined the Madrid System, rounding up the number of countries covered by WIPO's international trademark system to 130.

The Government of Mauritius deposited its instrument of accession to the Madrid Protocol with WIPO Director General, Daren Tang on February 6, 2023. Mauritius is the 114th member of the Madrid System. Its accession further strengthens the Madrid System's status as a truly global option for trademark protection, and particularly in the Eastern Africa and Indian Ocean Regions.

17. Publication of the first 3D application for industrial design

WHEN THE APPLICANT ATTACHED A 3D MODEL OF THE CLAIMED FLAW DETECTOR OBJECT FOR THE FIRST TIME The application with a 3D model of the claimed object (3D application) is published on the Eurasian Publication Server. The publication of the document took place in accordance with the Patent Regulations under the Eurasian Patent Convention.

Pursuant to the procedure, the application and the submitted documents, including 3D models of the claimed objects, are published by the Eurasian Office within one month from the date of sending the notification of successful result of the preliminary examination to the applicant<u>Read more</u>

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18. Mauritius Joins the Hague System

IT IS THE 70TH CONTRACTING PARTY TO THE 1999 ACT, AND 78TH MEMBER OF THE HAGUE UNION Mauritius has joined the Hague System, bringing the total number of countries covered by WIPO's international design system to 95. The Government of Mauritius deposited its instrument of accession to the 1999 Geneva Act of the Hague Agreement on February 6, 2023. Mauritius is the 70th contracting party to the 1999 Act, and 78th member of the Hague Union.

WIPO Director General Daren Tang welcomes the accessions of Mauritius to WIPO's Madrid and Hague Systems.

19. Brazil Joins the Hague System

Brazil is the largest economy in Latin America and its accession strengthens the status of the Hague System as a truly global option for securing design protection.

The Government of Brazil deposited its instrument of accession to the 1999 Geneva Act of the Hague Agreement on February 13, 2023. Brazil is the 71st Contracting Party to the 1999 Act and the 79th member of the Hague Union

20.Copyright Office to Reinstate Pre-Pandemic Notifications in eCO

TO AVOID CLOSURE AND ENSURE THE SHORTEST PROCESSING TIME FOR AN APPLICATION The U.S. Copyright Office will reinstate automated notifications and claim closures in the electronic registration system (eCO), which were suspended in 2020. Beginning on March 1, 2023, the Office will email applicants whose deposits have not been received. These applicants will have forty-five days to submit the missing deposit. If the Office does not receive the deposit, the claim will be closed, and the filing fee will not be refunded.

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The Office is taking this action because of thousands of incomplete registration claims that it cannot process. In each claim, the work being registered (the deposit) is missing......<u>Read more</u>
