01. Montenegro becomes 39th Contracting State

Montenegro today became the 39th state to join the European Patent Organisation. This follows the country's deposition of its instrument of accession to the European Patent Convention (EPC) on 15 July 2022. As of 1 October 2022, European patent applications will include the designation of the new contracting state Montenegro. The European Patent Office (EPO) will also take over the functions of a PCT receiving office and act as a PCT International Search and Examination Authority on behalf of Montenegro. According to Josef Kratochvíl, Chairperson of the Administrative Council of the European Patent Organisation, "the accession of Montenegro highlights the attractiveness of the European patent system for European economies... DUBAI – The Ministry of Economy of the United Arab Emirates held a workshop on September 13, 2022 briefing on the regulations of the new Patents and Industrial Designs Law, which forms part of the largest legislative amendments in the UAE's history.

The Ministry confirmed that all the required documents related to patent and industrial design applications such as Power of Attorney, Deed of Assignment and Certificate of Incorporation are no longer required to be legalized by the Consulate of the UAE, while the notarization of the same will be sufficient.

It was granted to the medical company Karl Storz (Germany). This is the third Eurasian patent owned by the German company – an international manufacturer and seller of endoscopes, instruments and devices. Over the year, the demand for Eurasian design patents has doubled.

The Eurasian Patent No. 100 was published in the database of the Eurasian Patent Office (EAPO), the administrative body of the Eurasian Patent Organization, uniting eight countries of Eurasian region. The granted patent will be valid on the territory of seven EAPO member states, except Turkmenistan. Karl Storz company has patented the design of a medical monitor, an application for a patent was filed by the applicant on May 30, 2022... Read more

On 1 October 2022, the Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH) programme between the EPO and the Superintendence of Industry and Commerce of Colombia (SIC) becomes permanent. The current conditions and requirements for participation will continue to apply. The offices have agreed to permanently extend the agreement, following the successful completion of a pilot programme, which was initially launched in February 2016 and extended in October 2019.

10. Hague System: Changes In Individual Designation Fees – Japan

Significant reductions are coming up in the individual designation fees applicable when designating Japan in an international application or in the renewal of an international registration.

New fees will be as follows:

- 507 (currently 603) Swiss francs per design included in an international application; and
- 574 (currently 683) Swiss francs per design included when renewing an international registration for the first, second, third or fourth time.

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11. PPH pilot program between the Japan Patent Office (JPO) and the National Institute of Industrial property of Brazil (INPI)

The Japan Patent Office (JPO) and the National Institute of Industrial Property of Brazil (INPI) have been implementing the Patent Prosecution Highway pilot program since April 2017. On 9 November 2021, the two Offices agreed to renew the program to extend the pilot period until 30 November 2026. The period may be further extended as necessary. Main content starts here. PCT-PPH will start under Japan-Brazil Patent Prosecution Highway pilot program - On 1 January 2022, the JPO and the INPI will start PCT-PPH in this pilot program. This will allow applicants to file a PPH request with the INPI based on international work products (Written Opinion (WO) and International.... Read more

12. The Harare and Banjul Protocols now effective in Cape Verde

Effective today, 14 October 2022, the Harare Protocol and the Banjul Protocol are now effective in The Republic of Cape Verde, making it the 20th contracting State of the Harare Protocol and the 13th contracting State of the Banjul Protocol. Pursuant to the Harare and Banjul Protocols, starting today, users of the ARIPO system can designate Cape Verde in their applications. Furthermore, Cape Verde nationals and residents are entitled, starting today, to file patent, industrial designs, utility models and mark applications directly with the ARIPO Office if they so wish. The Republic of Cape Verde on 14 July 2022 deposited its instruments of Accession to ARIPO and its Protocols... Read more
