On September 8, the Patent Office of the Republic of Latvia (LPO) implemented the European Cooperation Project "Capture and Store Historical Files" of the European Union Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO), by completing digitisation process of trademarks and designs dossiers. In total, 97,165 dossiers were digitised. By implementing this project, the LPO has taken further steps in the digitisation of its activities and is closer to introducing the principles of paperless office in terms of document circulation. The main benefit of this project is an accessibility of dossiers within the LPO document circulation system, which means that these documents are available on daily basis regardless of the physical location of the employees of the LPO, these docume... According to a decision jointly made by CNIPA and CIPO, the PPH pilot program between China and Canada will be extended for another five years between September 1 2021 and August 31, 2026. Relevant requirements and procedures to submit PPH requests to the two offices remain unchanged.

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7. IP Australia - Improvements to the designs system

Changes to help designers and improve the registered designs system are now law. These changes will provide more flexibility during the early stages of seeking design protection. Key changes include: 1. Introduction of a grace period. 2. Simplification of the design registration process.

What is a grace period? - A grace period is a set length of time after publicly disclosing your design where you can still file an application for design protection without affecting its validity. This means you can make your design public up to 12 months before applying for a design right. All without losing your ability to get IP protection. Currently, your registered design can't be certified if you made it public before applying. This... Read more

The U.S. Copyright Office has issued a proposed rule to establish procedures governing the initial stages of proceedings before the Copyright Claims Board (CCB). The proposed rule also establishes requirements regarding the directory for designated service agents. Initial public comments are due on October 29, 2021. Reply comments are due on November 15, 2021.

The Copyright Alternative in Small-Claims Enforcement (CASE) Act of 2020 directs the Register of Copyrights to establish regulations for all stages of a proceeding before the CCB. The proposed rule includes procedures for the initial stages of the proceeding, including the following:

On September 28, 2021, the Government of the United Arab Emirates deposited its instrument of accession to the Madrid Protocol with WIPO Deputy Director Generals Binying Wang and Hasan Kleib, making it the 109th member of the Madrid System, which now covers 125 countries. This also makes it the third country in the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), alongside Bahrain and Oman to join the Madrid Union. The Protocol will enter into force for the United Arab Emirates on December 28, 2021. Starting December 28, 2021, local brand owners in the United Arab Emirates will be able to start using the Madrid System to protect their trademarks in the 124 territories of the System's other 108 members by filing a single international... Today, the German government deposited the instrument of ratification for the PAP-Protocol. This is a decisive step on the way to the establishment of the Unified Patent Court after the work had been on hold for several years during the examination of the Agreement by the German Federal Constitutional Court (FCC). Following the decision of the FCC published in July this year the German law for the ratification of the UPCA and its Protocols was signed by the President and published in August allowing Germany now to proceed with ratification.
