The US Patent and Trademark Office on August 19, 2020, issued guidance memorandum to the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) regarding reliance on applicant admitted prior art in a petition for inter partes review. This memorandum, issued under the Director's authority to set forth binding agency guidance, provides the Office's interpretation of 35 U.S.C. § 311(b) that the basis for an inter partes review (IPR) must be a prior art patent or printed publication, and that statements regarding prior art in the challenged patent therefore cannot serve as the basis for instituting an IPR. Such statements, however, may provide evidence of the general knowledge possessed by a person of ordinary skill in the art, and may be used to support... Read more

In a welcome announcement, the EUIPO has confirmed that, with effect from 11 July 2020, it is now possible for any submitted EU registered design application to be made available to the Digital Access Service (DAS), which is run by WIPO. As background, the DAS is a convenient service run by WIPO which allows participating IP offices to effectively electronically share copies of IP applications as applied for. In practice, the service is used in the context of a first IP application (which might be a patent, trade mark, or registered design application) applied for in a first territory which is then used as a priority claim for any second IP application applied for in a different territory. In such situations, and without DAS, it was often necessary to submit a certified copy of the first IP application to the relevant IP office.... Read more

URSB will now use and accept the list of terms from the harmonised database of goods and services (HDB) in TMclass as well as the list of terms from the harmonised database of product indications (HDBPI) in DesignClass. Following URSB 's decision to use HDB and HDBPI there are now 11 non-EU IP offices in TMclass and 10 in DesignClass which use and accept terms from these harmonised databases. The addition of URSB in TMclass brings the total number of participating national and regional IP Offices, including ARIPO, OAPI, WIPO and EUIPO, to 81. Similar group codes are the codes assigned to goods and services that are presumed to be similar to each other in trademark examination. The project aims to improve the predictability of examination results, by encouraging users who file trademark applications with the JPO or the KIPO to utilize the concordance lists when.... The National Institute of Industrial Property (INAPI) announced in July 2020 the incorporation to the Global Patent Prosecution Highway (GPPH). Global PPH allows national patent applications to request accelerated examination at any of the 27 national offices of other member countries, always if the application contains claims which have been found acceptable by any of the other offices participating in this Agreement. The requirements are the following:

- The Chilean patent application in which the PPH is requested must have the same filing date or the same priority date as the application at the Office of Earlier Examination (OEE).

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15. Program on Mutual Cooperation in the Field of Deposit of Biological Materials for the Purposes of Patent Procedure between Taiwan and South Korea comes into effect on September 1, 2020

Following the launch of the cooperative program on mutual recognition of the deposit of biological materials for the purpose of patent procedure between Taiwan and Japan in 2015 and between Taiwan and the UK in 2017, the cooperative program between Taiwan and South Korea, based on an MOU signed in August, will be implemented on September 1, 2020. It once again expands Taiwan's scope of international cooperation in this field. Upon implementation of this program, TIPO will recognize the deposit at KIPO's designated depositary and KIPO will recognize the deposit at TIPO's designated depositary. Therefore, any Taiwanese applicant filing patent applications relating to biological materials with KIPO or any South Korean applicant filing patent applications relating to biological materials with TIPO is able to deposit his/her biological materials in a local designated depositary. This streamlines the deposit procedures for patent applicants in both countries, avoids problems due to the instability of biological materials that may be caused by crossborder deposits, and also reduces the cost of repeated deposits. At present, the depositary designated by TIPO is the Food Industry Research and Development Institute (FIRDI), while those designated by KIPO are the Korean Collection for Type Cultures (KCTC), the Korean Culture Center of Microorganisms (KCCM), the Korean Cell Line Research Foundation (KCLRF) and the Korean Agricultural Culture Collection (KACC).
