The International Bureau of the World Intellectual Property Organization has informed the United States Patent and Trademark Office that a new dollar amount has been established for the search fee required by the European Patent Office (EPO) when acting as an International Searching Authority. The new dollar amount of the search fee required by the EPO will be \$1,989 and will go into effect April 1, 2024.

Effective 06 March 2024, the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL) may act as an International Searching Authority (ISA) and International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) under the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) for international applications filed with the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) as a Receiving Office (RO/US). The dollar amount of the search fee required by the IPOPHL when acting as an ISA is \$600.... Read more

Our TM Checker tool successfully exits pilot, empowering small businesses with AI-driven trademark assistance.

On 30 April, our TM Checker tool advanced out of pilot. Launched in October 2022, TM Checker helps increase awareness of trademarks and provides a simple and user-friendly artificial intelligence (AI) tool to help users check the potential availability of their trademark for registration..

What were the results of the pilot?

Small businesses have traditionally been under-represented in the trade mark system, so TM Checker was designed to increase their participation. 2024 figures show an average of 660 daily views and 140 weekly applications which is an encouraging sign of innovation and brand protection.... Read more

As of 15 April 2024, the Trinidad and Tobago Intellectual Property Office (TTIPO) has made its trademark data available to the TMview search tool. With TTIPO on board of TMview, the tool now contains data from 77 participating offices. With the addition of more than 55.500 trademarks from TTIPO, TMview now provides information and access to more than 121 million trademarks in total . Since the introduction of TMview on 13 April 2010, the tool has served more than 128 million searches from users worldwide, with United States, Spain, Germany, Italy, the United Kingdom and China among the most frequent visitors. The integration of TTIPO in TMview is a concrete result of the EU funded project called CarIPI, which is directed by the European.... Read more

The PCT Minimum Documentation Task Force met to discuss forthcoming changes that will improve the quality of international patent searches. From 22 to 25 April 2024, the EPO hosted the 7th session of WIPO's PCT Minimum Documentation Task Force online. Good progress was made on the implementation of the new legal and technical requirements, to which PCT Authorities and other major offices should conform by 1 January 2026. These new provisions governing PCT minimum documentation will increase the number of patent collections available to International Searching Authorities, facilitate their accessibility, and thus further enhance the quality of international searches for the benefit of all stakeholders of the patent system, especially the users. At the Task Force meeting, the 28 delegations agreed on new technical.... Read more

Eight daily newspapers including The New York Daily News and The Chicago Tribune sued OpenAI and Microsoft on Tuesday seeking to stop the tech companies' from using copyrighted articles to train artificial intelligence chatbots. The copyright infringement suit claims the maker of ChatGPT copied stories from the newspapers "with impunity," never seeking permission or payment for the use of millions of articles that were used by the popular chatbot to respond to questions. ChatGPT, which relies on vast amount of data scraped from the internet, has become a direct competitor... Read more

China's National Intellectual Property Administration (CNIPA) announced on April 11, 2024 that it will join the Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH) Improvement Initiative (PPH改进倡议) in cooperation with the IP5 (China, the United States, Europe, Japan and South Korea). The Initiative's goal is to provide a more predictable examination cycle. Accordingly, CNIPA will aim for an average time to issuance of a first office action from grant of a PPH request at 3 months. Similarly, CNIPA will aim for an average time of Examiner response to Applicant's reply at 3 months. The Patent Prosecution Highway is an international cooperation... Read more

11. USERS FROM ONE MORE COUNTRY APPLIED FOR THE EURASIAN DESIGN SYSTEM

Today, the range of users of the Eurasian system for legal protection of industrial designs has been expanded to one more country. The first Eurasian application for industrial design was received from an applicant from Spain. During almost three years of functioning of the regional system for patenting industrial designs, applications have been filed by applicants from 27 countries. The most active users of the system are applicants from the Russian Federation as well as from the Republic of Belarus, the Republic of Kazakhstan and China.

One Eurasian application may include up to 100 industrial designs related to one class of the International Classification of Industrial Designs (ICID). An applicant may also supplement the application with a 3D model.... Read more
